Gary Johnson has agreed to coordinate this and be the contact person for this ministry while Pastor Rob is away. Before the summer, we will have a time to get together to learn about how to visit people in health care settings, i.e. praying with people, hospital visitation guidelines, etc.

Offering Envelopes and Electronic Giving

Daily Bible Readings for this Week

Two things stick out as we look at our readings list for this month. First, the predominant Gospel reading is from Mark's Gospel. Mark is focused on the cross. Everything in Mark's Gospel speaks of the urgency of the Cross in God's plan of salvation. The importance of Christ was his sacrificial death. And there is *urgency* to this message. The second thing we notice this month is the appearance of the Genesis story, the covenant between God and Abraham. As we begin the Lenten Journey, the readings point us to the very foundation of our faith: Covenant. We are a covenant people. God is a God whose covenant will not be broken. Even when we rebel and turn away, God will remain faithful, even to the point of giving His Son.

The daily Bible readings are clustered into weeks with Sunday being the center of each week. The lessons come from the Revised Common Lectionary. The readings for Thursday, Friday, and Saturday of each week orient our prayer and preparation for the Sunday lessons. The readings for Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday reflect on Sunday's lessons. In the worship of Grace Church we normally read only two lessons. However, many Sundays the Psalm for the day is also incorporated into the service as a Call to Worship or prayer.


