CPR - First Aid - AED

We have had interest from the congregation for a FIRST AID/CPR/AED class. After significant research, we found the most convenient one is at Frederick Community College. It is their HEARTSAVER CPR/FIRST AID class, and is offered multiple times throughout the year. The class is 8 hours, and options exist for full day Saturday, full day weekday, and a two-day weeknight course. The course description is:

Course SAF156

This Heartsaver® CPR/First Aid/AED teaches students critical skills needed to respond to and manage an emergency until emergency medical services arrives. Skills covered in this course include first aid; choking relief in adults, children, and infants; and what to do for sudden cardiac arrest in adults, children, and infants.

These classes are open to the public, but we are suggesting **Friday, May 18th** as a time for members of our congregation to attend, in the hopes that you will attend with others that you know. We will also monitor their website for the next weekend class, and notify in the newsletters and church bulletin when those are posted. Fees are \$45 and \$50 for out of state residents. Certification and a textbook are included. If you want to see the course materials a sample will be provided at church; please see Mark Edwards or Gwen McGee.

Do you get a little chilly in church? Please know that there are knitted shawls available for you to use as you need. They are spread throughout the sanctuary. Please ask an usher if you don't see one near you. Many thanks to Pam Marshall for this idea and for making the shawls!


Summer is coming...

Frederick's Amazing Faith Dinner Dialogues

Daily Bible Readings for this Week

The readings for April point us in the direction of new beginnings. The readings from Acts are yearly readings as we focus our post resurrection attention to the Apostles and life in the early days of the Church. The Hebrew Scripture readings focus us on the prophets' teachings about the new life we anticipate in the Kingdom of God. While there will indeed be struggles in this world, the prophets' words of gloom are always tempered with words of hope and assurance. You belong to God and in the end...God has the final word!

The daily Bible readings are clustered into weeks with Sunday being the center of each week. The lessons come from the Revised Common Lectionary. The readings for Thursday, Friday, and Saturday of each week orient our prayer and preparation for the Sunday lessons. The readings for Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday reflect on Sunday's lessons. In the worship of Grace Church we normally read only two lessons. However, many Sundays the Psalm for the day is also incorporated into the service as a Call to Worship or prayer.


