

Scripture Reading

Introduction: Today's Epistle reading is part of a letter written by the Paul to the church in Ephesus that describes how Christian faith and practice are connected, and how belief shapes behavior. In this section, Paul uses contrasts to describe what it means to "put off the old self" and "put on the new self". In verse 25, Paul says that the new life in Christ means relinquishing falsehood and committing to speaking the truth to one another.

Ephesians 4:25 (New International Version)

25 Therefore each of you must put off falsehood and speak truthfully to your neighbor, for we are all members of one body.
