Daily Bible Readings for February

Two things stick out to as we look at our readings list for this month. First, the predominant Gospel reading is from Mark's Gospel. That's not peculiar to this month, but rather indicative that we are in Year B of the lectionary cycle. The lectionary (you may remember) has three years: A, B & C. They focus on Matthew, Mark and Luke, respectively. John is used in all three years. This year is Year B and so we see the prevalence of Mark's version of the Gospel. What makes Mark's Gospel unique? I'm glad you asked! Mark is focused on the cross. Everything in Mark's Gospel speaks of the urgency of the Cross in God's plan of salvation. For this reason, Mark records no Birth stories and has a very brief resurrection narrative. The importance on Christ was his sacrificial death. And there is *urgency* to this message. The word "immediately" appears more in Mark's gospel than in any other. The second thing we notice this month is the appearance of the Genesis story, the covenant between God and Abraham. As we begin the Lenten Journey, the readings point us to the very foundation of our faith: Covenant. We are a covenant people. God is a God whose covenant will not be broken. Even when we rebel and turn away, God will remain faithful, even to the point of giving His Son.

Our readings list comes from the <u>Revised Common Lectionary</u> recommended for use by the United Church of Christ and by many other Christian denominations in North America. The daily Bible readings are clustered into weeks with Sunday being the center of each week. The readings for Thursday, Friday, and Saturday of each week orient our prayer and preparation for the Sunday lessons; the readings for Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday reflect on Sunday's lessons.

In the worship of Grace Church we normally read only two lessons. However, many Sundays the Psalm for the day is also incorporated into the service as a Call to Worship or prayer.
