Dear Friends,

I have to write this. I don't want to, but the newsletter needs to get printed, so I can't wait any longer. I am at a loss of things to say to you. As I write this, there is yet another school shooting, the 18th since the beginning of the year and it is only February. Our government is in turmoil, our president is under investigation. Experts predict foreign interference in upcoming elections will continue. Tensions with North Korea continue to mount. I don't have any more words.

I'm tired of the "Thoughts and Prayers" from leaders who are more concerned with protecting their own power then their own people. I'm tired of a government that is hell bent on catering to the rich even if it means stepping on the faces of the poor to do it. I'm just tired and I'm sad. And I'm tired of feeling this way. I want someone to just make it better, take us back to a better time or wake up and have it be behind us. And I know that many of you, good people on both "sides of the aisle," feel the same way.

And then I am reminded that it is Lent. Not just a season of reflection and penitence, but a season in which the Church walks a dark and lonely road. As Jesus descended the mountain and walked the long road to Jerusalem, so we, too, walk that road with him. Lent is a time to be reminded that we do not walk the road alone. The psalmist said it this way:

I lift up my eyes to the mountains where does my help come from?
My help comes from the Lord, the Maker of heaven and earth.
He will not let your foot slip he who watches over you will not slumber; indeed, he who watches over Israel will neither slumber nor sleep.
The Lord watches over you the Lord is your shade at your right hand; the sun will not harm you by day, nor the moon by night. The Lord will keep you from all harm he will watch over your life; the Lord will watch over your coming and going both now and forevermore. (Psalm 121)

So when I have no words, except anger and fear, God walks the road with me. When I don't know what the future holds, or how those in control will use that control, God walks that road with me. And so, in the face of dead school children, rising conflict, and government dysfunction, I have few words of hope. But the ones I have are the only ones I need: God walks the road with me. From where does my help come? Where do I look to find hope? My help comes from the Lord. Let us in these troubled times, unite as one people and keep our eyes on the hills, from whence comes our help. And may God continue to walk this Lenten road with us.

OUTREACH

Special Offering for March: One Great Hour of Sharing

One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) is the special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that carries God's message of love and hope to people in crisis. The UCC works with international partners and other Christian denominations to provide sources of clean water, food, education and health care, small business micro-credit, advocacy and resettlement for refugees and displaced persons, and emergency relief and rehabilitation. OGHS also supports domestic and international ministries for disaster preparedness and response.

On average, of every dollar given to One Great Hour of Sharing, 95 cents is used directly for mission programming, and the remaining 5 cents is used to create interpretation materials. Administrative costs are paid by gifts to Our Church's Wider Mission National Basic Support.



Almost 60 percent of the UCC's offering supports international development initiatives, including annual support for missionaries. The offering also funds disaster preparedness and response, and disaster-related volunteer initiatives in the U.S.

The United Church of Christ responds to development, disaster, and refugee needs in 138 countries, and provides disaster relief and immigration assistance in the United States. Nearly one-third of the UCC's offering is shared through Church World Service to support refugee, disaster, development, and advocacy programs.

Words cannot capture the anguish of people when they lose everything in a disaster or have to leave it behind while fleeing war or conflict. Through One Great Hour of Sharing, lives are literally changed daily. Your support provides clean water, food, medicines, shelter, healthcare, education and so much more. For All the Saints

Richard Allen March 26th (1831) First Bishop of the African Methodist Episcopal Church

Richard Allen (1760 – 1831) was a minister, educator, writer, and the founder in 1816 of the African Methodist Episcopal (AME) church, the first independent black denomination in the United States. He opened its first church in 1794 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He was elected the first bishop of the AME Church. Allen had started as a Methodist preacher but wanted to establish a black congregation independent of white control. The AME church is the oldest denomination among independent African-American churches.

Richard Allen was born on February 14, 1760, in Germantown, Pennsylvania into slavery. In 1777 Richard Allen bought his freedom and that of his brother.

In 1786, Allen became a preacher at St. George's Methodist Church in Philadelphia, but was restricted to early morning services. As he attracted more black congregants, the church vestry voted to build a segregated gallery for the use of blacks. Allen and Absalom Jones, also a Methodist preacher, resented the white congregants' forcing them to a segregated section for worship and prayer. They decided to leave St. George's to create independent worship for African-Americans. This brought some opposition from the white church and the more established blacks of the community. In 1787 Allen and Jones led the black members out of St. George's Methodist Church.

They formed the Free African Society (FAS), a non-denominational mutual aid society, which assisted fugitive slaves and new migrants to the city. Over time, most of the FAS members left with Absalom Jones to form a new congregation, which opened its doors as an Episcopal parish on July 17, 1794 as the African Episcopal Church of St. Thomas.

Allen and others wanted to continue in the Methodist practice. Allen called their congregation the African Methodist Episcopal Church (AME). Using a converted blacksmith shop which they moved to the site on Sixth

Street, they opened the doors of Bethel AME Church on July 29, 1794, and were affiliated with the larger Methodist Episcopal Church. In 1799, Allen became the first black Methodist minister, ordained by Bishop Francis Asbury, in recognition of his leadership and preaching.

In 1816 Allen united four African-American congregations of the Methodist Church. Together they founded the independent denomination of the African Methodist Episcopal Church (AME), the first fully independent black denomination in the United States. On April 10, 1816, Allen was elected its first bishop.

Bishop Allen died at home on March 26, 1831.
